## Bulletin 1

The Korea Waterski & Wakeboard Association (KWWA) will host the 2016 IWWF Asian Waterski & Wakeboard Championships at Lake Bulgap, Yeonggwang-gun County, Jeollanam-do Province, Korea from Tuesday, August 23<sup>rd</sup> to Saturday, 27<sup>th</sup> Saturday, 2016.

In addition to Open Tournament and Wakeboard events, the Championships will include Under 17 Tournament, Masters Tournament (40+) and Masters Wakeboard (30+).

Yeonggwang County (*Yeonggwang-gun*) is a county in South Jeolla Province, South Korea. Yeonggwang is famous for its large production of Small yellow croaker which Korean people choose as one of the best presents to give to other people. It is called *Yeonggwang gulbi* (meaning dried croaker) among Koreans.

Tournament Waterski disciplines (slalom, trick and jump) and wakeboard will be run simultaneously at two different areas at Lake Bulgap Reservoir.



The average temperature in August is between 23°C to 29°C.

### 3. Entry Conditions & Administration

Only paid-up member federations of IWWF Asia are qualified to participate in the 2016 IWWF Asian Waterski & Wakeboard Championships. All athletes must be entered by their respective Federations, including individual athletes.

**a. Intention to Enter:** Each federation shall submit to the organizing committee and to the Secretary General of IWWF Asia, not later than sixty nine (69) days before the scheduled start of the first event of the 2016 IWWF Asian Waterski & Wakeboard Championships, its intent to compete. Any federation not meeting this requirement may not be allowed to compete unless they pay a penalty of US\$5.00 per day to the organizer. Each federation shall submit to the organizing committee and to the Secretary General of IWWF Asia, not later than thirty (30) days before the scheduled start of the first event of the 2016 IWWF Asian Waterski & Wakeboard Championships, the names of the members of its team, the disciplines (Tournament and Wakeboard), the events each will enter, the ranking of each skier/rider, as well as the names of the official reserves. Any federation not meeting this requirement may not be allowed to compete, or if so allowed at the discretion of the Chief Judges and the organizing committee until the federation pays a penalty of US\$1.00 per day after the 30-day deadline to the organizer for each skier/rider not officially entered. If the official entry forms are not received 24 hours prior to the start of the first event, the federation's skiers' and riders' places in the draw, if allowed to participate, shall be determined by the respective Chief Judges without reference to their ranking.

### 4. Rules - General

The competition will be conducted according to the IWWF Asian Technical Rules for Tournament and Wakeboard.

The following serves to summarize tournament and wakeboard rules. If there are any contradictions, the 2016 Asian Tournament and Wakeboard Rules will be used.

In case of doubt as to the nationality of a competitor, the Judges normally will refer to his passport. #### 4A. TOURNAMENT TEAM OVERALL COMPETITION – ADDITIONAL EXPLANATION

As per the 2015 Asian Tournament Rules, there will be three (3) separate team **AWARDS** for Open, Masters and U17. For Open, the best three scores, men **AND** women, in eliminations or finals shall be summed up to obtain the team score. For Masters and U17, the best two scores, men **AND** women, in eliminations or finals shall be summed up to obtain the team score. At least one score for each sex is to be used.

The Max Kirwan Shield will be awarded to the team with the highest overall combined team score of these three separate events.

#### 4B. WAKEBOARD TEAM OVERALL COMPETITION – ADDITIONAL EXPLANATION

There will be two (2) separate team **AWARDS** for Open Wakeboard and Masters Wakeboard. The Max Kirwan Wakeboard Team Overall Shield will be awarded to the team with the highest overall COMBINED team score of both Open and Masters.

#### 5. Homologation

This competition will be Record Capability (RC) homologated.

#### 6. Language

#### 7. Entry fee

Entry fee for each athlete will be USD200.00 This includes airport and venue transfers, lunch on competition days and fee for the Opening Ceremony and Closing Ceremony Dinner. Entry fees must be paid in cash during registration before the event begins. Entry fees must be paid for in cash during registration in US Dollars.

#### 8. Official's Fee (Federation Officials, Team Managers & Coaches)

Official's fee for each federation official attending in an official capacity will be USD10.00 per day per person. This includes airport and venue transfers, lunch on competition days and fee for the Opening Ceremony and Closing Ceremony Dinner. Official's fee must be paid in cash during registration in US Dollars

#### 9. Friends & Family Fee - Opening Dinner and Banquet Final Night Party:

The price for non-athletes eg. friends and family to attend both the Opening and Closing Ceremony Dinner will be total USD50.00 per head (buffet and beverages included). This includes airport and venue transfers, lunch on competition days and fee for the Opening Ceremony and Closing Ceremony Dinner. Fees must be paid in cash during registration in US Dollars.

#### 10. Accommodation

The organizing committee, The Korea Waterski & Wakeboard Association (KWWA), will manage all hotel accommodation. Federations are requested to submit hotel reservations to the KWWA and not to contact the hotels directly.

### Official Hotel – Hotel Glory

This hotel is reserved for IWWF Asia Officials, KWWA officials, Asian Federation Presidents, technical officials and event staff. The hotel rate is inclusive of a breakfast buffet which will be served from 23<sup>rd</sup> to 28<sup>th</sup> August 2016. The Opening & Closing Ceremonies, IWWF Asian Federation Congress, Asian Tournament Council Meeting and Asian Wakeboard Council Meeting will be held here.
